

Regulations Governing the Implementation of the Academic Research Ethics Education Course at Wenzao Ursuline University of Languages

Approved at the Academic Affairs Committee on June 6, 2017
Ratified by the President on June 20, 2017

- I. To improve the research ethics literacy of students of master's degree programs and students of in-service master degree programs, the University has stipulated the regulations governing the implementation of the "Academic Research Ethics Education" Course (hereafter referred to as "the Course").
- II. Starting from the Academic Year of 2016, all students of master's degree programs and in-service degree programs must take the Course during their first year of enrollment. Students who have already taken the course should present the proof of course completion for the course to be waived by their graduate institutes.
- III. Implementation of the Course:
 - (1) Every academic year, the Office of Academic Affairs and the Division of Continuing Education should submit the information of newly enrolled students to the on-line platform of the "Center for Taiwan Academic Research Ethics Education" so that students can have their own accounts.
 - (2) Within their first academic year, students should take the Course at the on-line platform of the "Center for Taiwan Academic Research Ethics Education" and students must pass the exams on-line to receive the proof of course completion on-line.
 - (3) Based on their own characteristics and needs, each graduate institute may assess and recognize the on-line courses offered at the on-line platform of the "Center for Taiwan Academic Research Ethics Education" and relevant ethics courses offered by the University or other universities, or take alternative measures.
- IV. Students of master's degree programs must present the proof of course completion or relevant proof showing that the student has completed the course or completed the alternative measure before applying for the master's degree examination.
- V. The Regulations become effective after they are approved by the Academic Affairs Committee and ratified by the President. Revisions must follow the same procedures.
